Preface

Thank you for choosing the i-walk, the co-botic device that cleans faster, cleaner, safer, greener, and is better for everyone. The i-walk compact design allows you to clean right to any edge, minimizing manual scrubbing. The battery-operated i-walk in combination with an i-mop XL provides a deep scrub and a great cleaning result. The i-walk significantly reduces the amount of chemicals needed, which leads to a greener result. It also reduces the risk of slippery floors. The i-walk is coated to withstand abrasive chemicals. This means it can be used at facilities like swimming pools.

Please read this manual carefully for important information and operating instructions before using the i-walk. Save this manual for future reference. This i-walk will provide excellent performance. The best results are obtained when the i-walk is:

- Regularly maintained per the i-walk preventive maintenance instructions in this manual.
- Operated with reasonable care and caution.
- Maintained with manufacturer-supplied parts.

When this manual refers to "the manufacturer", this means Future Cleaning Technologies B.V., an affiliate company of i-team in Eindhoven, The Netherlands. When this manual mentions "the partner", this refers to your local i-team resell and support service partner.

Purpose of the user manual

The purpose of the user manual is to provide the user with information in such a way that during the lifespan of the i-walk, the machine is used correctly, efficiently and safely, even in the event of reasonably foreseeable misuse, as described in section 1.2 of this manual. The user manual contains instructions regarding:

- personal operator safety;
- intended and non-intended use of the i-walk;
- instructions for daily use;
- maintenance instructions;
- storage conditions;
- disposal of the i-walk.

These instructions must be considered to avoid risks that could lead to physical and/or material damage.

Target audience

This user manual is intended for operators of the i-walk and their supervisors, as well as partners and importers.



Operators of the i-walk

The i-walk may only be operated by a person who has correctly read and understood the instructions in this manual or is trained by an experienced operator who has read and understood the instructions in this manual.

Reading guide

The following symbols and terms are used throughout this manual to alert the reader to safety issues and important information:

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1 Introduction

The i-walk is a safe, user-friendly machine. This manual helps you to get started and explains the setup, operation and maintenance procedure. You will be pleasantly surprised by the fast and effective use of the battery-operated i-walk. The battery used in the i-walk comes from the same family as the ones used in a variety of battery-powered i-team products. The battery must be fully charged before use. Please see the user manual of the battery charger for the correct procedure.

This manual is intended for those who work with the i-walk and/or perform daily maintenance. The manual must be read fully before starting to work with the machine. This manual describes the correct method of use, safety measures, maintenance, and transport.

The manufacturer continuously improves all its products based on user experience and feedback. Any deviations between the texts and/or images from the manual and your i-walk can therefore arise from the difference in model, or from possible changes due to continuous development and innovation.

1.1 Intended use of the product

The i-walk is a machine that connects with the i-mop XL to combine the unequaled cleaning results of the i-mop XL with powerful and modern co-botic technology.

1.2 Non-intended use of the product



WARNING

Non-intended use can have consequences for the safety of operators and bystanders and will void the warranty on the product.

- DO NOT use the i-walk in areas above a sea level of 2000 m.
- DO NOT use or park this product in a pure-slope place with a slope angle greater than 5°.
- DO NOT use this product in an environment with a temperature higher than 40 °C and lower than 0 °C.
- DO NOT wash or spray the i-walk with water.
- DO NOT place any objects (including children and pets) on the static or moving i-walk body.
- DO NOT use this product to clean
 - o any burning objects (such as burning cigarette butts),
 - o any hard objects,
 - o any sharp objects (such as decoration wastes, glass and nails).
- DO NOT use this product on
 - o soil surfaces.
 - o grasses,
 - o artificial turfs,
 - o carpeted floors.
- **DO NOT** use this product in case of rough surface conditions, such as uneven ground or ground with large potholes. Bypass these dangerous areas when planning a path.
- DO NOT deploy and use this product in humid environments. Excessive humid environments may cause damage to electronic circuits or electronic components in this product.
- DO NOT approach the i-walk suddenly or block the i-walk. Prevent both people and pets from doing this to avoid collision and damage.

1.3 Lifespan

Each i-walk is guaranteed to operate for at least 2000 hours.



CAUTION

To ensure proper and safe operation throughout the life of the i-walk, the machine must be checked by an authorized i-team partner every 10,000 hours.

1.4 Modifications

It is not permitted to make modifications to the design of the i-walk without consultation and permission from the manufacturer. Doing so affects the warranty, see section 1.6 of this manual.



Your i-team partner needs this number when you order parts.



The serial number can be found on the inside of the battery compartment lid (Figure 4, pos. 1).



The i-walk consists of the following parts:



- 5. On/Off indicator



2.2 Handle controller

The handle controller has the following buttons:

- 1. ON/OFF button
- 2. LOCK/UNLOCK button
- 3. AUTO FILL button
- 4. TEACH REPEAT button
- 5. START/STOP button
- 6. CANCEL button



2.3 Main menu of the i-walk app

The main menu of the i-walk app shows information about a site, task reports and a summary of cleaning data for all i-walk devices on that site, see section 6.5.

When opening the i-walk app, you might be required to log in. Use the following details:

- User name: The last 9 digits of the serial number, see section 1.7
- Password: 12345678



3 Safety

Safety comes first. Therefore, please take your time to read and understand these safety instructions. Improper use can cause harm or void the manufacturer's warranty.

3.1 General safety instructions

3.1.1 Sweep before scrub

Remove objects from the floor that can be propelled by the rotating brush.

3.1.2 Machine orientation

Always keep the main body of the i-walk in an upright position when inserting the battery or sim card.

3.1.3 Batteries

Always use the automatic battery charger provided by the manufacturer.

CAUTION

During normal operation, the 24 V battery and 25.2 V battery cause no safety hazard on their own. Please adhere to the following safety instructions regarding batteries:



- Do not crush, pierce or damage batteries in any way.
- Do not heat or incinerate batteries.
- Do not short-circuit batteries.
- Do not dismantle batteries.
- Keep all batteries dry.
- Only charge between 5 °C~40 °C / 41 °F~104 °F.
- Only use between 5 °C~45 °C / 41 °F~113 °F.

3.1.4 i-mop XL safety

Refer to the manual of your i-mop XL before use and adhere to all safety instructions that apply to the i-mop XL.

3.2 Risks during operation

3.2.1 Radio interference

The i-walk is a Class A product which may cause radio interference. If this is the case, the operator may need to take practical steps against interference, such as planning another path or shutting down equipment.

3.2.2 Transparent materials

Although additional sensors have been installed and measures have been taken, glass walls or other highly transparent materials may affect the i-walk sensor function. Therefore, it is recommended to keep the i-walk away from such materials.



3.2.3 Mark the job site

The i-walk is designed to leave a dry floor without slippery patches, no additional drying is required. When running the i-mop XL with the vacuum function OFF please mark the job site with a wet floor marker.



WARNING

In the event of an accident, press the emergency button on top of the i-walk. This will prevent the i-walk from causing harm.

3.3 Risks after operation

3.3.1 Remove the battery

CAUTION



Before removing the batteries, make sure to turn off the i-walk via the power button on the main unit (see Figure 5, pos. 13) and the ON/OFF button on the handle controller (see Figure 7, pos. 1). Removing the batteries without turning off the i-walk may result in the battery 'sparking' and causing problems with the connectors.

It is best practice to remove the battery after executing any cleaning or maintenance task. Be sure to take the battery out in case of long-term storage.

3.3.2 Careful when storing

Do not store the i-walk on ramps or slopes. Always store the i-walk on a level, hard surface.



4 Transport and storage

4.1 General



CAUTION

Always keep the main body of the i-walk in the upright position.

Before storage or transport, disconnect the main body and the handle controller of the i-walk from the i-mop XL. Remove the batteries after each use.

4.2 Store position

The correct store position is the upright vertical position. Refer to the documentation of your i-mop XL for information on storing your i-mop XL.

4.3 Transport inside/outside



CAUTION

The wheels of the i-walk are not designed to roll over dirty surfaces. Sand can cause the wheels to block. Lift the i-walk while moving it from one building to another.



CAUTION

The i-walk is heavy. Do not try to carry the unit by yourself. You should always use someone's help.

When transporting the i-walk inside:

2. Move the i-walk to its destination using the handles (Figure 9, pos. 1).

When transporting the i-walk outside:

3. Move the i-walk to its destination using the handles (Figure 9, pos. 1).

4.4 Transport in a vehicle

The i-walk is a compact machine and fits in the trunk of your car. Before loading the i-walk into your vehicle, make sure that the batteries are removed.

Do the following:



CAUTION

The i-walk is heavy. Do not try to carry the unit by yourself. You should always use someone's help.

- 1. Lift the i-walk into your vehicle by lifting it at the bottom.
- 2. Prevent the i-walk from moving around during transport by using a tension belt or another appropriate restraint.



5 Assembly and installation

The requires some assembly before use. You will have to insert the batteries into the main unit and the handle controller. You will also need to connect the main unit and the handle controller of the i-walk to and i-mop XL.

5.1 Unboxing

The i-walk is packed in a single box. The battery for the main unit and charger are optional. They can be ordered separately as they can also be used for other i-team products. When ordered with the i-walk, they are packed in the same box in a separate compartment.



5.2 Assembly

5.2.1 Charging the battery

Charge the battery according to the instructions in the battery charger manual. Make sure the battery is charged regularly.

5.2.2 Inserting the batteries



CAUTION

Only use i-power® batteries specifically designed for use in the i-walk.

- 1. Open the battery compartment lid on the main unit (Figure 11, pos. 1).
- 2. Push the battery (Figure 11, pos. 2) in the battery slot. A click indicates that the battery is locked.
- 3. Close the battery compartment lid.



- 4. Press the power button (Figure 12, pos. 2) on the battery for the handle controller (Figure 12, pos. 1) to turn it on.
- 5. Slide the battery for the handle controller into the handle controller. A click indicates that the battery is locked.



5.2.3 Charging the remote control battery

To charge the remote control battery, you must use the supplied USB-C to USB-A cable.

To charge the remote control battery, do the following:

- 1. Connect the USB-C connector from the USB-C to USB-A cable to the USB-C port (Figure 13, pos. 1) of the remote control.
- 2. Connect the USB-A connector to the USB-A port of a power adapter or a laptop.

The battery will be charged.



5.2.4 Preparing the i-mop XL

To connect the main unit of the i-walk to the i-mop XL, you must first connect the right steel bar to the i-mop XL. Refer to the model of your i-mop XL to determine which steel bar to use. The installation process is the same for both steel bars.

- 1. Use the provided wrench (Figure 10, pos. 3 & 6) to remove the front wheels (Figure 14, pos. 2) from the i-mop XL.
- 2. Remove the existing wheel axles (Figure 14, pos. 1).



The i-walk comes with 2 sets of connection bars and dedicated axles. The type to be used depends on the transport wheels of your i-mop XL:

- L-shape transport wheel: Connection bar with 1 hole (Type I) and corresponding axles (Figure 10, pos. 2 & 4)
- U-shape transport wheels:
 Connection bar with 2 holes (Type II) and corresponding axles (Figure 10, pos. 5 & 7)
- 3. Reinstall the wheels with the dedicated axles (Figure 15, pos. 1).



- 4. Place the steel bar (Figure 16, pos. 1) between the two wheels of the i-mop XL and tighten the small ring (Figure 16, pos. 3).
- 5. Tighten the large ring (Figure 16, pos. 2) to secure the connection.



5.2.5 Installing the trolley handles (optional)

1. Install both trolley handles (Figure 17, pos. 1) on the i-walk with a Phillips head screwdriver.



5.2.6 Connecting the i-walk to the i-mop XL

Ensure that the i-mop XL has been set up for use according to the instructions in the i-mop XL user manual.

1. Slide the handle controller (Figure 18, pos. 1) onto the handle of the i-mop XL.



2. Press the Lock button (Figure 19, pos. 1) on the handle controller. The light will be blue to confirm that the wheels of the main unit of the i-walk are locked.



- 3. Push the i-mop XL into the main unit of the i-walk with some speed. The i-walk will lock onto the steel bar of the i-mop XL. Moving the i-walk too slowly will not trigger the lock mechanism.
- 4. Close the fix ring (Figure 20, pos. 1) around the i-mop XL.



5. Lock the fix ring by turning the butterfly clasp (Figure 21, pos. 1) clockwise. The i-walk is ready for use.



6 Operation

6.1 Before you start



ATTENTION

Always check the following items before starting to make sure your i-walk is ready for use.

Before operating the i-walk, make sure that:

- The batteries of the i-walk are installed, see section 5.2.2, and fully charged, see the manual of the battery charger;
- The battery of the remote control is fully charged, see section 5.2.3;
- The i-mop XL is correctly set up, see the manual of your i-mop XL.

6.2 Setting up the i-walk

6.2.1 Powering-on and unlocking the i-walk

- 1. Press the power button on the main unit (Figure 5, pos. 13), the i-walk will now power on.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button on the handle controller for a few seconds (Figure 7, pos. 1), the handle controller will now power on. A solid blue light indicates a successful Bluetooth connection.
- 3. Press the LOCK/UNLOCK button on the handle controller, (Figure 7, pos. 2), the i-walk will now be unlocked.



6.2.2 Placing the QR code block

1. Place the QR code block on the wall between 25-40 cm above the floor (Figure 22, pos. 1).



6.2.3 Connecting the i-walk to the network (optional)

The i-walk can be connected to the network via a SIM card. When a SIM card is used to connect to the network, it will connect automatically after inserting the SIM card. Make sure the i-walk is turned off when inserting the SIM card.

Connecting to the network via a SIM card:

- 1. Remove the cover plate (Figure 23, pos. 1).
- 2. Open the rubber cap on the SIM card slot (Figure 23, pos. 2).
- 3. Insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot.
- 4. Close the rubber cap.
- 5. Replace the cover plate.



6.2.4 Turning on and connecting the remote control.

The remote control is linked to this specific i-walk.

- 1. Press the power button to turn on the remote control
- 2. Press the connect button to connect the remote control to the i-walk.

The i-walk ring will start "breathing" blue light, indicating that it is connected to the remote control.



6.3 Auto Fill mode

The Auto Fill mode allows you to set a boundary for an area you want to clean. The i-walk will clean the entire area within the boundary and will never leave the created area. Note that the stand-alone Auto Fill task will only be executed once and then forgotten by the i-walk.

- Press the Auto Fill button (Figure 24, pos. 1). The Auto Fill button will be white.
- 2. Guide the i-walk around the boundary of the area you want to clean. When you arrive at the starting point, the Start/Stop button (Figure 24, pos. 2) will flash blue.
- 3. Press the Start button to begin the automatic cleaning. After cleaning, the i-walk returns to the starting point and automatically stops.



6.3.1 Auto Fill with QR code

Ensure the QR code block has been placed on the wall, see 6.2.2.

1. Position the i-walk about 30 cm in front of the QR code (Figure 25, pos. 1). The Auto Fill button and Teach Repeat button will flash blue when the QR code is recognized.



- Press the Auto Fill button (Figure 26, pos. 1). The Auto Fill button will be white.
- 3. Guide the i-walk around the boundary of the area you want to clean. When you arrive at the starting point, the Start/Stop button will flash blue.
- 4. Press the Start button (Figure 26, pos. 2) to begin the automatic cleaning. After cleaning, the i-walk returns to the starting point and automatically stops.
- 5. Press the Stop button (Figure 26, pos. 2) at any time during the cleaning to stop the i-walk, and use the app to edit the cleaning map, see 6.5.4.
- 6. Press the Start button to resume the cleaning.



7. If you want to cancel the current task at any time, press and hold the Cancel button until there is a small beep sound and the Cancel button turns red. The i-walk can now be taken do do another task.

6.4 Teach Repeat mode (with QR code)

The Teach Repeat mode allows you to clean an area once and teach the i-walk to clean the area in the future. Ensure the QR code block has been placed on the wall, see 6.2.2.

1. Position the i-walk about 30 cm in front of the QR code (Figure 27, pos. 1). The Teach Repeat button will flash blue when the QR code is recognized.



- 2. Press the Teach Repeat button (Figure 28, pos. 1). The Teach Repeat button will be white.
- 3. Guide the i-walk around the area you want to clean. When you arrive at the starting point, the Start/Stop button (Figure 28, pos. 2) will flash blue.
- 4. Press the Start button to save the path.
- 5. For future cleaning sessions, position the i-walk in front of the QR code again. The Start button will flash blue when the QR code is recognized.
- 6. Press the Start button to start the cleaning.



6.5 Using the i-walk app

The i-walk app shows information about your i-walk devices, shows notifications and allows you to edit cleaning maps. The i-walk app is preinstalled on the supplied smartphone.

6.5.1 Overview



The Overview screen of the i-walk app shows an overview of the currenty active site, with data about the site, a task report and information about the cleaning area and time for that site.

- Tap the [Profile] button (Figure 29, pos. 1) to view Site menu.
- Tap [View More] (Figure 29, pos. 6) to open the Task Report.
- Tap the buttons at the bottom (Figure 29, pos. 3 & 4) to switch to the Machine or Notification menu.



6.5.2 Site info

The Site Info menu shows a list of available sites.

• Tap any available site (Figure 30, pos. 1) to go the Overview for that site.



6.5.3 Machine overview

The Machine overview shows a list of machines that are active on your current site.

• Tap any machine (Figure 31, pos. 1) to open the menu for that machine.

6.5.4 Machine menu

The Machine menu shows information about a specific machine and allows you to edit the cleaning map of that machine.

- Tap the [Nut] icon (Figure 32, pos. 1) to edit the cleaning map. You can draw on the map to indicate areas to avoid.
- Tap the [Report] button (Figure 32, pos. 2) to open the Machine Report.
- Tap the [Task Report] button (Figure 32, pos. 3) to open the Task Report.
- Tap the [Machine Info] button (Figure 32, pos. 4) to view information about the machine.



6.5.4.1 Machine report

The Machine Report shows the cleaning data, cleaning area and cleaning time for the machine.



6.5.4.2 Task report

The Task Report shows information about a cleaning task that is in progress or that has been completed.

- Tap the button in the top right (Figure 34, pos. 1) to mark all current reports as read and remove them from the view.
- Tap a report in the list (Figure 34, pos. 2) to open the Task View.

6.5.4.3 Task view



The Task View shows all the information about a cleaning task, including the progress, information about the machine, information about the task and cleaning data.

• Tap the [Share] button (Figure 35, pos. 2) to share or export the cleaning task information.



6.5.4.4 Machine info

The Machine Info menu shows information about a machine, including the name and hardware and software versions.

- Tap the [Self-check] button (Figure 36, pos. 1) to run a diagnostic check on the machine.
- Tap [Remove machine] (Figure 36, pos. 2) to remove the machine from your i-walk app.



6.5.5 Notification menu

The Notification menu shows a list of notifications from all the machine on a site.

- Tap the button in the top right (Figure 37, pos. 1) to mark all current reports as read and remove them from the view.
- Tap a specific notification (Figure 37, pos. 2) to view it in more detail.

Every notification shows information about the machine that is affected and some suggestions in case any follow-up is necessary.



6.6 Deleting a cleaning path

The Auto Fill or Teach Repeat task that has been linked to a QR code can also be deleted.

- Position the i-walk in front of the QR code. The Start/Stop button (Figure 39, pos. 1) will flash blue when the QR code is recognized.
- 2. Press and hold the Cancel button (Figure 39, pos. 2) for a few seconds. A beep will confirm the deletion of a cleaning path.



6.7 Emptying and filling water tanks

When the clean water tank of the i-mop XL is empty, the i-walk will automatically stop and the light bar on the front will flash white.

- 1. Unlock the fix ring of the i-walk (Figure 40, pos. 1).
- 2. Empty the wastewater tank of the i-mop XL according to the instructions in the manual of your i-mop XL.
- 3. Refill the clean water tank of the i-mop XL according to the instructions in the manual of your i-mop XL.



- 4. Lock the fix ring of the i-walk.
- 5. Press the Start button (Figure 41, pos. 1) on the handle controller to continue the cleaning for another sessions.



6.8 Pausing the i-walk

- 1. Press the stop button during operation to pause the i-walk. The Start/Stop button will flash blue.
- 2. Press the Start button to resume.

6.9 Cancelling a cleaning task

1. Press and hold the cancel button for a few seconds to cancel the current cleaning task. A beep will confirm the cancellation of the cleaning task.



6.10 Emergency stop

1. In case of emergencies, press the emergency stop button on the main unit of the i-walk (Figure 42, pos. 1). The i-walk will stop and the light bar will flash red.



- 2. Twist the emergency stop button to release it. The light bare will flash white.
- 3. Press the Start button on the handle controller to activate the i-walk again.



6.11 Shutting down the i-walk

- 1. Press the power button on the main unit of the i-walk (Figure Figure 5, pos. 13). The light in the power button and the light bar on the front of the i-walk will turn off.
- 2. Press and hold the ON/OFF button (Figure 44, pos. 1) on the handle controller. The button will flash red once and the lights on the handle controller will turn off.





5. Step on the pedal (Figure 46, pos. 1) at the bottom of the main unit to detach it from the i-mop XL.



6. Detach the handle controller (Figure 47, pos. 1) from the i-mop XL.



6.12 Linking/resetting the handle controller

To link a new handle controller or reset the connection, follow the steps below:

1. Turn off the main unit of the i-walk with the power button (Figure 5, pos. 13).

- 2. Press and hold the ON/OFF button (Figure 48, pos. 1) and the CANCEL button (Figure 48, pos. 2) on the handle controller simultaneously. The handle controller will beep 3 times to indicate that the connection has been deleted.
- 3. Turn on the main unit with the power button (Figure 5, pos. 13).
- 4. Press the bumper of the main unit (Figure 5, pos. 9) twice. The i-walk will beep several times, after which the light bar will turn white and the beeping will stop.

The handle controller has now been connected to the main unit.



6.13 Cleaning

6.13.1 Removing the battery

- 1. Power off the i-walk by pressing the power button (Figure 5, pos. 13).
- 2. Open the battery compartment lid (Figure 49, pos. 1).
- 3. While pressing the blue tabs (Figure 49, pos. 3), pull the battery (Figure 49, pos. 2) out of the compartment.
- 4. Close the battery compartment lid.



7.1 Daily maintenance

Check that the sensors of the i-walk are clean and the wheels are not damaged.

7.2 Two-weekly maintenance

7.3 Recommended additional cleaning

Clean the exterior of the i-walk weekly with a non-abrasive, non-solvent cleaner or a clean, damp cloth.

7.4 Recommend service time

Service must be done by one of our service partners. The first service is recommended after 10,000 hours, when the driving wheels should be replaced.


